Welcome to **Smith Mountain Lake State Park**

The largest plants are trees. This checklist will help you identify some of the trees. Start by looking at the leaves. Do you notice different patterns and shapes?

Check them off as you observe and be sure to note interesting features; such as the texture of the bark, twigs or seeds.

Seeds may be in the form of nuts, as with the hickory and oak; fruits on the black cherry; cones on the hemlock and pines; or "samaras" on the maple.

Remember, nature is best left undisturbed. Leave only footprints and take only lasting memories.
